The Student Council workshop titled 'Student Leadership', held for our Student Council members from the six Kolkata Loreto schools was organized by the Education Office on the 10th June 2025 at Loreto House, Mary Ward Hall.

- o Have a mindset to work
- o Possess the tenacity to hold on and get work done till the end
- o Not compromise with virtues such as honesty, integrity and self-respect
- o Adopt a practical approach

With pre-dominant thoughts on: Do I make a mess of my common sense and wisdom; my ethical sense and do I explore, the students were guarded in their views and left the workshop searching for the answers to these questions.



While summing up, Fr Shaju made it quire clear that 75% of a leader is the profiling whereas the remaining 25% is what you build along in the journey.
